The IMO team consists of two coordinators. ms. Saskia Bak and ms. Beate Durlinger coordinate procedures for the international exchange students. Students can contact the staff members of IMO for practical issues, but also when they need help finding their way around campus, the city of Nijmegen or adjusting to the Netherlands and the Dutch. The staff members of IMO can refer students to the right person or institution if they do not know whom or where to turn to within the faculty with a specific type of question they might have.

Application exchange programme

Admission requirements:

To take part in an exchange with NSM, students:

- Need to have the right qualifications for any course they want to follow. NSM Master's courses can only be taken if students have a completed Bachelor's degree in the relevant field of study.
- Need to be proficient in English in order to be able to follow courses at Radboud University: an official (signed and stamped) university certificate of an English language course level B2 (Common European Framework), or a Cambridge First

Certificate in English (minimum level B2), or a TOEFL test certificate with a score of at least 79 points (internet based), or an IELTS test certificate with a score of at least 6.0, or a TOEIC test with a minimum score of 670 (The modules 'Speaking and Writing' and 'Listening and Reading' have to be successfully completed) is required. In addition, C1 level is required for all Master's courses. Native English speakers and students whose entire study programmes are taught in English are exempt.

- Be nominated by one of our partner schools before the deadlines shown below. The exchange coordinator needs to nominate students, by sending an email to imo@fm.ru.nl with students particulars.
- Submit their application before the deadlines shown below.

Nomination deadline:

Autumn term (first semester): 1 May

Spring term (second semester): 1 November

Students' application deadline:

Autumn term (first semester): 1 June

Spring term (second semester): 1 December

The International Mobility Office will then enter students into the nomination system, after which the central International Office will email the student all the information he/she needs for the application (tip: check the spam box, since emails sometimes get lost there).

The student will then receive login and password from the International Office. Students can fill in their application forms for the academic year online. For more information, visit: www.ru.nl/english/application.

After the online application, students will receive confirmation by email. They can then send the Central International Office the signed application and the other necessary documents by post. Unfortunately, incomplete application packages cannot be processed and students will therefore not be enrolled! We suggest students to make copies of all forms for their own administration. With the complete set of documents and the Radboud coordinator's approval, we will be able to start processing the enrolment at the university and arranging housing.

Housing

The housing department of the International Office can assist students. A request for assistance can be made by indicating on the online application that a student needs housing. The housing department will do its utmost to find housing for our incoming students, but cannot give any guarantees. The International Office mediates in and allocates these rooms, but the rooms are owned by the Short Stay Housing Nijmegen (SSHN). When there are rooms available, the IO will assign you a room. Availability is scarce and the housing department cannot guarantee to assign the room of your preference.

Costs of living

Academic Calendar

NSM's courses are based on the semester. Visiting exchange students are welcome for 1, or 2 semesters. Each semester is divided in two blocks or quarters. Lectures and classes are taught during these periods, usually a course runs for one block.

Autumn term (first semester): Beginning of September – End of January

Spring term (second semester): Beginning of February – End of June

Students are expected to stay at NSM until they have completed their final exams. Students can take one resit for any failed course, during designated resit periods. On certain conditions they can take the resit at their home university. The resit must be taken at exactly the same day and time as in Nijmegen, the Netherlands, and the home university must co-ordinate and supervise the exam. The exam resits of the second semester take place at Radboud University in August. For more information, please contact the IMO.

Courses

Exchange students can choose courses from curriculum of the programmes offered at NSM.

The full-time workload is 30 ECTS per semester, equivalent to 840 study hours. 1 ECTS is equal to 28 study hours.

Grading

The Dutch grading system is an absolute grading system. Grades are awarded on a scale from 0 to 10, 0 being the lowest and 10 being the highest. Grades from 6 upwards are regarded as 'pass'.

V or VOLD: Passed (no exact grade given, but student has fulfilled the requirements)

O or ONV: Failed (no exact grade given, but student has not fulfilled the requirements)
